In the late 1960s, the Northern Ireland Government established a Committee chaired by the Rt Hon R W B McConnell to “ examine the existing law for the general regulation of building in Northern Ireland in the light of recent changes in Scotland, England and Wales ” . The Committee ’ s report, published in March 1970, recommended that the existing control of building through bye-laws and local Acts should be replaced with a new Building Act and Regulations similar to those in place ...
