The study group time is distinguishable in that the focus is clearly on "how I am doing as a teacher." In secondary schools, using a planning period for study groups has not worked well—probably because those having the same planning period are from differing content areas.

Group Salutes: A moment shared between two or more students at the beginning or end of an activity, a Group Salute is a teacher-prompted interaction that is a quick, low-prep way to cultivate community.
