The first three kings of Israel were Saul, David and then Solomon. After Solomon the kingdom was divided into two parts and separate kings ruled over Judah and over Israel. The reigns of these kings are described in the books of Kings and Chronicles in a very interesting way:

Kings of Judah and Israel

God ruled over Israel in the Promised Land from the time of Joshua (1405 B.C.) to Samuel and his sons (1050). Saul then becomes the first anointed human king when the people reject the Lord's rule over them (1Samuel 8 - 9). His reign ends when, after wounded in battle, he takes his own life on Mount Gilboa (1Samuel 31:1 - 6, 2Samuel 1:1 - 5).

The date of the division of the kingdom is approximately 931 BC. The following is a list of the kings of Israel and Judah. The dates of their reigns are approximate, due to overlapping reigns, associated sovereignty, intervals of anarchy, and the Jewish practice of counting parts of years as full years. The United Monarchy is the name given to the Israelite kingdom of Israel and Judah, during the reigns of Saul, David and Solomon, as depicted in the Hebrew Bible. This is traditionally dated between 1047 BCE and 930 BCE. The Book of Kings depicts Josiah as the complete opposite of his immediate predecessors, the most pious, saintly ruler Judah ever had (2 Kings 23:25). Josiah is said to have led a religious reform in the vein of his illustrious great-grandfather, Hezekiah, stamping out pagan cults and centralizing the worship of Yahweh at the Temple in Jerusalem.
