Student information card of Charles Ell, a member of the Blackfoot Nation, who entered the school on October 5, 1916 and departed on August 29, 1918. The file indicates Ell was transferred to the Chemawa Indian School in Salem, Oregon upon the closure of the Carlisle Indian School.

The North Blackfoot, the Bloods and the Peigan comprise the Blackfoot Nation in the lands that today include southern Alberta and Montana. Written at ability level grades 1-3, interest grade level 5-12, with a Guided Reading Level at N, in three formats, Computer Book, Audio Book and Paperback Book.

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A unique book that considers the two health structures that exist on the Peigan reserve in southern Alberta (one based on Western European theories, and the other which is based on traditional Blackfoot culture).
