In other words, do not give credit for preceding, unadministered items. 2. Before obtaining the standard score in the norms tables, you must convert the total raw score to a weighted raw . score using the conversion table.

To score the WIAT-II-T Reading comprehension subtest when the reverse rule has been applied, test administrators are to ensure that they ' ve calculated the weighted raw score before the standard score. This will then take into account the item set the child took. The standard score is then calculated for the actual age of the child (so that you are always comparing a child ' s performance to their age peers).
